

Father Tom was pastor at SJV from 1996 to 2015 and was key to getting the parish involved with Faith Action for Community Equity (FACE).

Celebrating his return were three familiar faces from Faith Action: Jessica Fernandez White, Christy MacPherson and Patrick Zukemura. Jessica was the first Executive Director of FACE, hired in 1995. Christy was one of the earliest community organizers and became Executive Director in 2017. Patrick must be the longest-serving staff member of FACE, serving as an organizer from its beginnings until his retirement in 2021.


CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER

A Year of the Holy Spirit (The Gift of Piety)



Piety also makes us love and have affection for "God's friends" — the Blessed Mother Mary, the saints and the angels; or "God's representatives" who exercise His authority — the Holy Father, the bishop, or parents; or "God's treasures" — the Bible, the church, or blessed religious objects. Concerning piety toward God's treasures, as a child, I was taught to kiss the Bible and the crucifix, to bow my head at the name of Jesus, to be quiet and respectful in God's house, and to avoid walking on blessed graves — all acts of piety.

As such, the Gift of Piety perfects the virtue of justice, enabling the individual to fulfill his obligations to God and neighbor, and to do so willingly and joyfully. With piety, the person is not only motivated by the requirements of strict justice but also by the loving relationship he shares with his neighbor. Simply, a person wants to do what is right in the eyes of God. A person thereby should have a respectful obedience to lawful superiors, as well as a humble respect for peers and subordinates. For example, St. Teresa of Kolkata always taught her sisters to treat those they cared for, as though they were caring for Jesus Himself, and to do so with a joyful heart and with a smile.







Dear Friends,

Peace be with you!

Consider this: you see brown-skinned family living in a van, and you guess that they might be Micronesian, but you don't really know. To be honest, you don't really care. If anything, you're annoyed that they are there.

An elderly man ends up in the hospital with kidney failure. A nurse calls you to say that he is asking for you. He has no family. He has no one. Could you visit? Well, you say, he's not really a friend, more like an acquaintance. True, you used to work together, but that was a long time ago. Besides, you have your own health issues to consider.

You convinced a woman to keep her child and you are proud of that, but then when she approaches you, in obvious need, carrying her newborn, you pretend you don't see her. You've got enough on your plate.

The Gospel for this Catholic Charities Sunday, the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, relates a scenario similar to these, with a terrifying turn. The one not recognized is you.

"Then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' He will say to you in reply, 'I do not know where you are from. ... Depart from me' ... For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."


