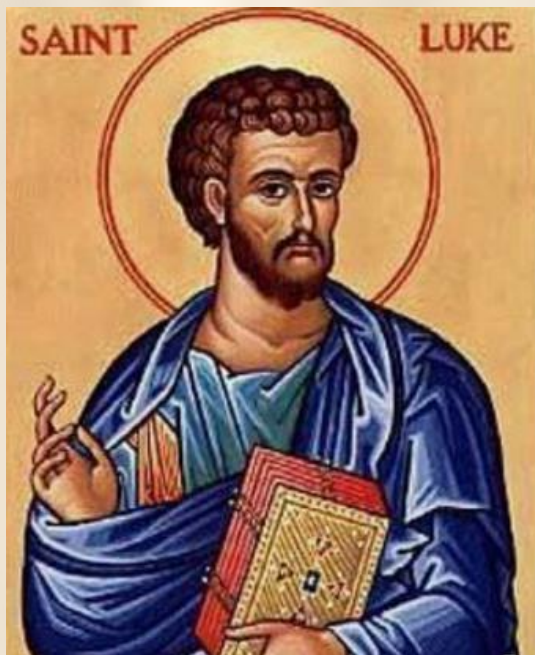

World Mission Sunday **2022**

ONE SUNDAY FOR THE WHOLE WORLD

EVERY YEAR, SOMETHING SPECIAL HAPPENS on the next-to-last Sunday of October. **WORLD MISSION SUNDAY** joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass that Sunday, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism to be missionaries, through prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the collection for the **Society for the Propagation of the Faith**.

In 1926, Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide World Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme: "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8). He reminds us that the Church is missionary in nature and that we are called at Baptism to share in this mission together. The Holy Father exclaims, "Would that all of us in the Church were what we already are by virtue of baptism: prophets, witnesses, missionaries of the Lord, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to the ends of the earth!"

On World Mission Sunday, we join our Holy Father in supporting his missions. As we pray and respond here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions.

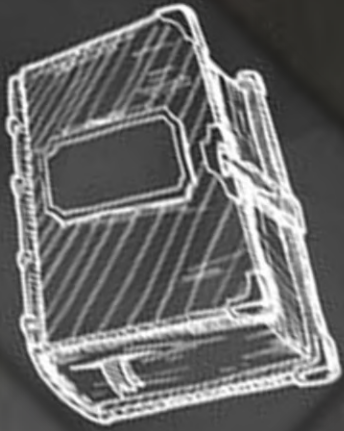

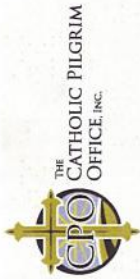

WEDNESDAY - APRIL 19, 2023 HONOLULU TO USA/MEXICO CITY
Depart from Honolulu to mainland USA/Mexico City.

THURSDAY - APRIL 20, 2023 MEXICO CITY Depending on flight, arrive at the Int'l airport of Mexico City and transfer to a hotel for a 5-night stay. Dinner and overnight.

FRIDAY - APRIL 21, 2023 OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE SHRINE & THE PYRAMIDS OF TEOTIHUACAN

Today, we start our pilgrimage going to the most important site of our solemn journey, the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Following breakfast, we start the day visiting the Square of 3 Cultures and the Parish of Santiago Tlatelolco, famed for being the seat of the 1st Archbishop of Mexico and where Juan Diego took the flowers that miraculously created the iconic image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Then we will visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the main Altar to see the Tilma, the side chapels & attend mass to receive the Holy Eucharist. We will also visit the 1st hermitage chapel, the Indian Chapel, the Holy Water Well Chapel, the Original Basilica including the church at the Tepeyac Hill where the apparitions took place. We will also take a tour inside the church where we celebrate mass. We will explore different places inside or outside the Shrine. The rest of the day we will tour the town of Tlaxcala & visit the church, the site of the apparitions and home of Juan Bernardino, Juan Diego's uncle who raised him. Its church is known as the Church of the 5th Apparition, more locally known as Santa Maria Tulpetlac. This church was designated by St. John Paul II as the World Center of Healing. There is a healing well under the altar. We will also visit the Acolman monastery (former monastery of San Agustin), built in the 16th century. Then we will spend time at the world-renowned Archeological city of Teotihuacan and its incredible pyramids of the Sun and the Moon. Lunch on your own at the pyramids or somewhere. Return to Mexico City for dinner and overnight.

SATURDAY - APRIL 22, 2023 MEXICO CITY

Mexico City tour, driving through its modern & ancient avenues, streets & squares to visit the Metropolitan Cathedral, the National Palace, and the City Hall, all located at the

hundreds of religious articles stores; visit the Church and plaza of St. Dominic (Sto. Domingo) and the San Francisco and La Profesa churches built in the 16th century.

Drive through Tacuba street to see the ancient buildings, squares & monuments, the square of Santa Veracruz (Holy Cross) and its leaning churches. Stop to visit San Hipolito parish church and see the famous image of St. Judas Thaddeus; 2nd most important and visited place in the city after the Shrine of our Lady of Guadalupe.

We will continue through the modern Pink Zone (Zona Rosa) and Polanco districts that are full of restaurants, bars, stores and night entertainment; go through Chapultepec park and its museums onto Insurgentes boulevard (considered to be the longest avenue in town) passing Siqueiros Poliforum and Insurgentes theater to see the famous mural paintings until we reach the colonial San Angel district to visit El Carmen parish church with its colonial arts museum and the beautiful world renown colonial San Jacinto square; and The Chimalistac Chapel. Our journey continues to the University and its mural paintings accomplished by famous Mexican artists, the Cuicuilco archaeological zone and its rounded pyramids and then onto Xochimilco: the Aztec floating gardens for a Prehispanic boat ride and a visit to the San Bernardino Monastery. Continue to Coyoteacan through the colonial cobblestone roads to one of the conquerors' residential areas to explore its premises and view the paintings of the 16th century San Juan Bautista (St. John the Baptist) church and Sta. Catalina (St. Catherine) church. Lunch on your own. Dinner and overnight in Mexico City.

SUNDAY - APRIL 23, 2023 MEXICO CITY—PUEBLA After breakfast, we head west towards Puebla, Mexico's 4th largest city, passing through the famous snow capped volcanoes Smoking Mtn (5464m) & Sleeping Lady (5230m). We will stop at Santa Maria Tonantzintla Church in Cholula, to enjoy the most beautiful example of Indo-Christian decoration. Its interior is an explosion of color and gold leaf, adorned by angels displaying distinctive Cholula Indian features.

Continue to Puebla, known as the City of Angels. This city is a UNESCO World Heritage site located in a valley between snow capped volcanoes. Puebla has a mild climate year-round. It is considered to be the cradle of Mexican cuisine



having produced some of the country's classic dishes like mole sauce and chiles en nogada. The city is also known for its beautiful churches, its hand painted "Talavera" tiles and colorful pottery. Here, we will visit the Cathedral de Puebla, grand cathedral with an octagonal altar and Templo de Santo Domingo which houses the famous Capilla de Rosario (Rosary Chapel). We will also explore St. Francis Church a historic baroque style convent & temple. **MASS AT THE ROSARY CHAPEL** at the **STO DOMINGO CHURCH** Lunch on your own.

Dinner & overnight (IN PUEBLA)

MONDAY - APRIL 24, 2023 PUEBLA—TLAXCALA—MEXICO CITY Today our pilgrimage leads us to San Miguel de los Milagros and its holy water from its well. We will visit the Grotto where St. Michael the Archangel appeared to Diego Lazaro de San Francisco in 1631 and told him of a miraculous spring; we will also visit the archaeological city of Cacaxtla.

Our journey continues to Tlaxcala city to visit the Basilica of our Lady of Ocotlan. The Blessed Virgin appeared to Juan Bernardino in 1531 and miraculously stamped her image of perfection into a trunk of an old oak tree. Our visit to Tlaxcala city will also include the newly designated UNESCO World heritage sites such as the Tlaxcala Cathedral known as the Cathedral of Our Lady of Assumption of Tlaxcala, and the Franciscan Ensemble of the Monastery. We will celebrate MASS at the Monastery of San Francisco, also known as the Lourdes of Mexico because of its miraculous statue & spring water. Then return to Mexico City. Lunch on your own

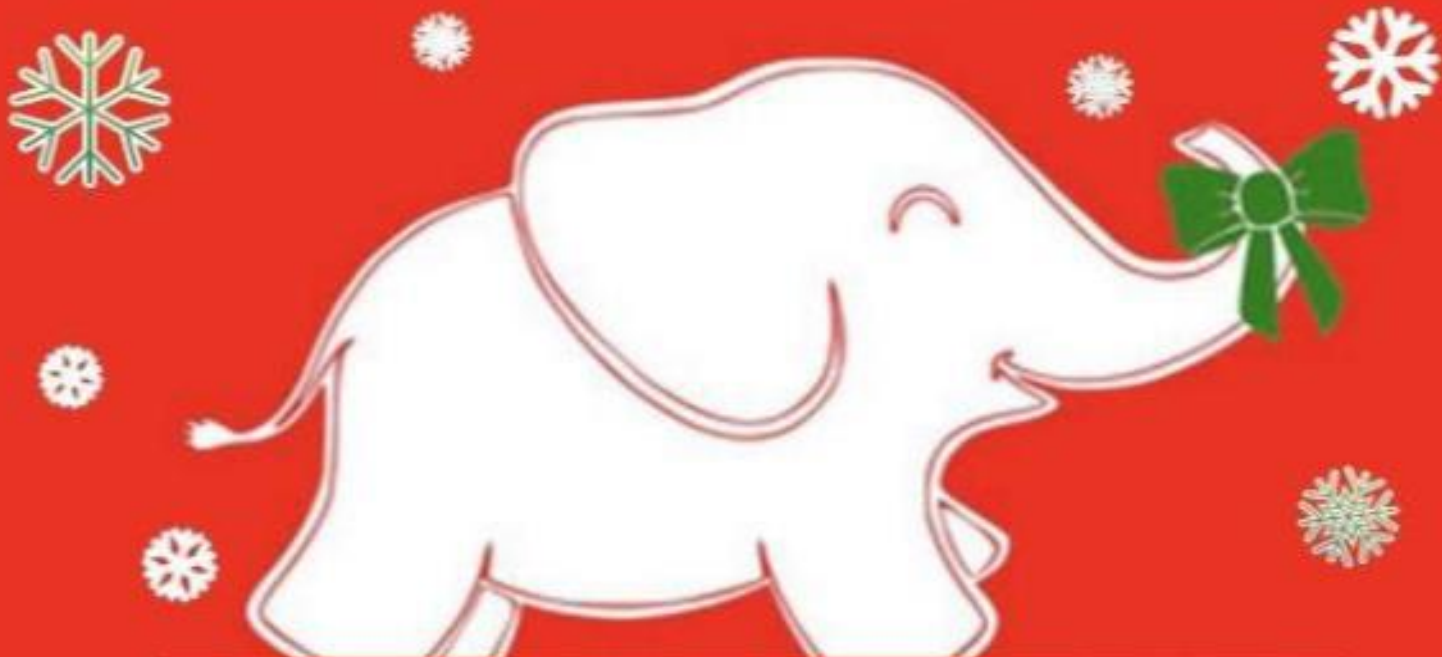

1. Over this past year, we have shared about the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Like all gifts they must be opened before we can use them.
2. "Peter said to them repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit". (**Acts 2:38**)
3. We received the Holy Spirit in baptism and again in Confirmation but as adults, we need to consciously surrender our lives to him. We can have the Holy Spirit active in our lives by asking him in, but we must really desire to know him intimately.
4. Receiving the Holy Spirit will be the beginning of a much deeper relationship with our Creator and Lord. Not only will the gifts be activated in our lives but many more gifts will be at our disposal for the community of believers.
5. "...they were all in one place....then there appeared to them tongues as of fire which parted and came to rest on each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit". (**Acts 2:1,4**)
6. The infilling of the Holy Spirit can happen when the body of believers lay hands on us. " Peter and John went down and prayed for them ...Then they laid hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit." (**Acts 8: 15-16**)
7. "The life in the Spirit is not a once-done event. It is meant to grow in us. ... People have different experiences when touched anew by the Holy Spirit. Some experience a new closeness to Jesus, some find that Scripture comes alive. Some receive a charismatic gift like tongues, prophecy or healing. For me the primary gift of this renewal in the Spirit was meeting God the Father...at a new degree of intimacy that was overwhelming." **Fr. George Montague SM, author of Father's Embrace**
8. Prayer and action is the way to activate the Spirit within, therefore go frequently to prayer to be filled with the Spirit.
9. The Spirit comes to our aid in our weakness for we do not even know how to pray. The Spirit Himself intercedes for us in such a way that we find ourselves lifted beyond ourselves to the mystery of God Himself.
10. When we surrender our will to the Holy Spirit, He will come in a very powerful way. We will experience his love and presence like never before!
