Presence of Jesus in Adoration

What Do You Do During Adoration?

Once you've decided to go to Eucharistic Adoration, the next common question to answer is what you should or can do while there. Catholics of all ages who attend Eucharistic Adoration for the first time feel at a loss regarding what they should be doing. Should you sit or stand? Should you kneel like the person in the seat next to you? Is it OK that one person is reading while another seems to be writing something in a notebook? Questions like these are normal. Most people have asked them or at least wondered about them at some point in their Catholic walk. If you feel at a loss about what you should do during Eucharistic Adoration, take heart. Below, you'll find a list of acceptable actions you can take so you can enter the presence of Jesus with confidence and humility and experience the blessing of the Adoration of the Eucharist:

Be There: One of the most fundamental things you can do regarding Eucharistic Adoration is to "be there." Leave all your fears about specifics at the door, and simply approach Jesus with humility and reverence.

Pray the Rosary: Many Catholics use their time in Eucharistic Adoration to pray the Rosary. The Rosary offers a helpful way to spend a large chunk of time in prayer while meditating on various mysteries of the Catholic faith.

Write in a Prayer Journal: For many Catholics, memorizing prayers and knowing how to pray can seem hard. Everyone has different natural abilities, and some think better and are more thoughtful when they write. The act of writing allows their inner thoughts to come forth and can help them process their true feelings about a certain matter and be connected.

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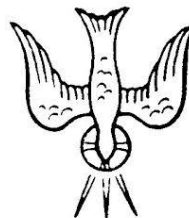

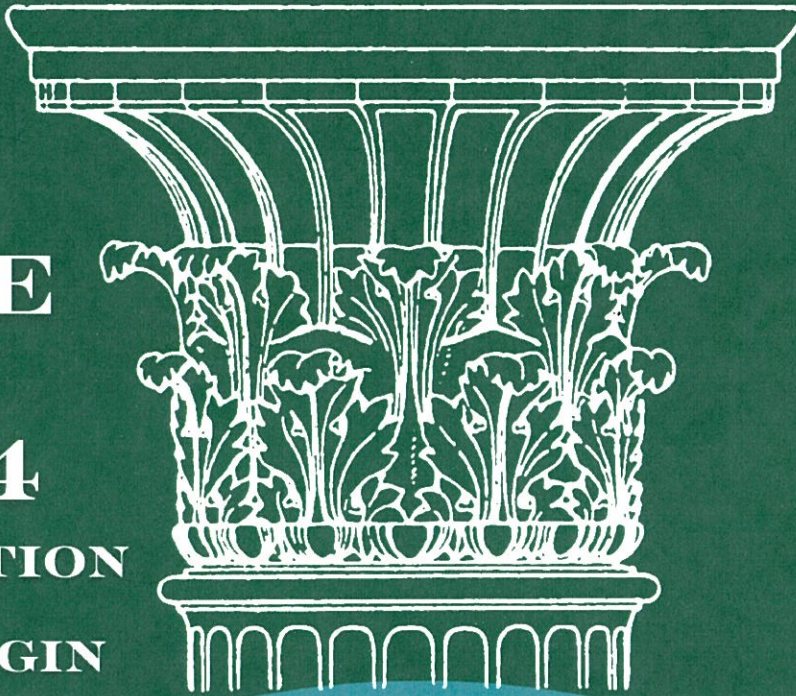

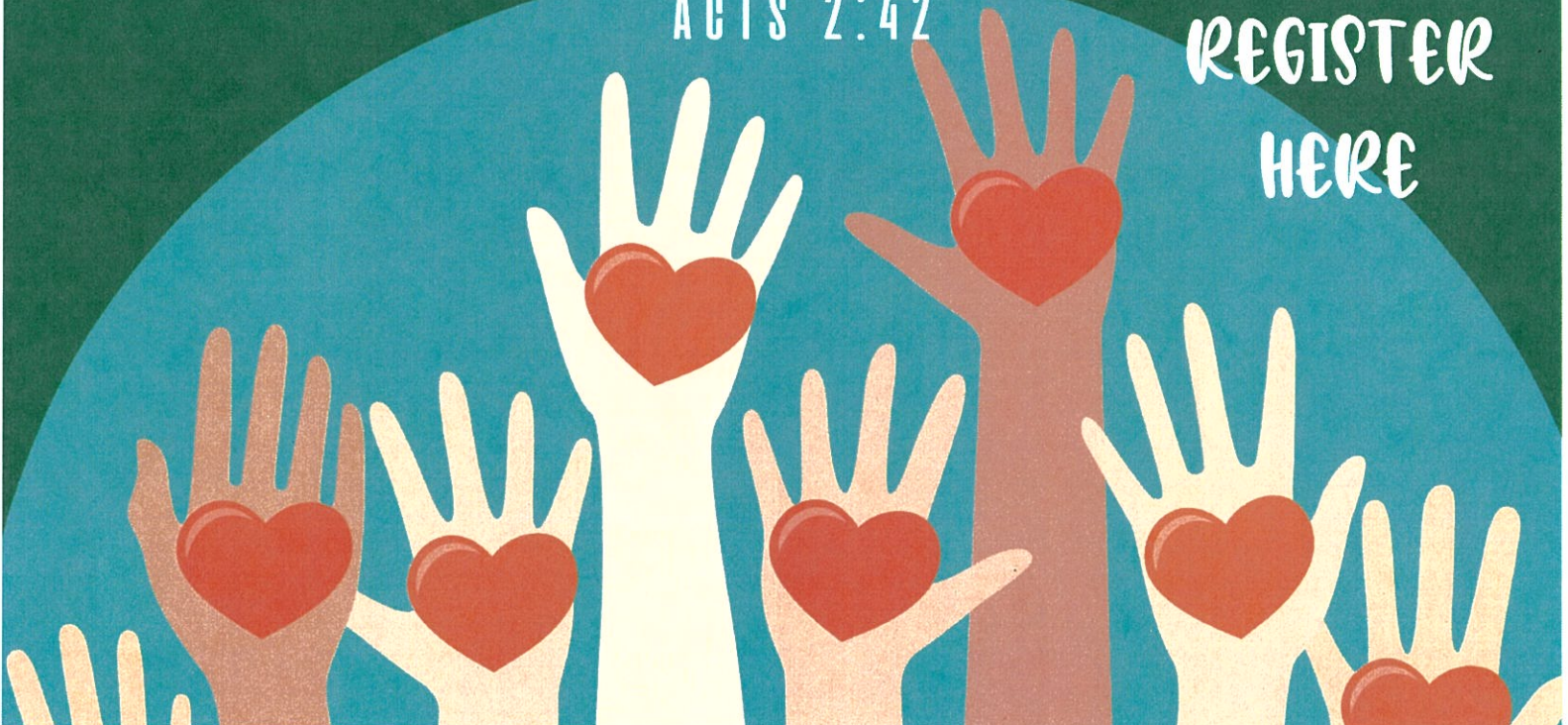

The Year of Parish Revival

Experience the presence of Jesus during Adoration of the Eucharist

- Eucharistic Adoration involves exposing a consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, allowing people to sit and pray in the presence of Jesus Christ.
- In the presence of the Eucharist, we pray to the power and sacrifice that it represents — the body of Jesus, who gave His life so that we may have eternal life.
- Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist.
- Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God.
- Eucharistic adoration is a beautiful time to sit in silence with our Lord and spend time with Him, free from distraction.
- It is a good time to give thanks to the Lord for what He has done in our lives while looking at Him in the gift of the Eucharist.
- While it is true that you can pray to God anywhere and that He is always within you, it is especially powerful to adore Jesus in the Eucharist.
- How to prepare for Eucharistic adoration:
 - Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ
 - Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
 - Focus on the mysteries of the rosary, the Passion of Christ, or a particular Scripture verse.
 - Write in your prayer journal. ...
 - Listen to praise and worship music through headphones.
 - Read a book by one of the saints (such as “The Diary of St. Faustina”)
- You can come for as long or short as you wish, but while you are there you can simply tell God how amazing He is.
- You don't have to say anything, you don't have to make sure you're "doing" adoration correctly. Instead, experience the joy of being with someone who wants to have a deep, intimate, friendship with you.
