NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

This past weekend saw the launch of the four legs of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, an unprecedented effort to walk with the Eucharist thousands of miles across the United States as a public witness to the Church's teaching that the Eucharist is truly the body of Jesus Christ. Catholics on four edges of the country — San Francisco, southern Texas, northern Minnesota, and Connecticut — took part in the celebrations to accompany the Eucharist as well as two dozen young pilgrims on their two-month journeys, which will culminate at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis July 17–21, 2024.

Presence of Jesus in Adoration

What Do You Do During Adoration? *(continued)*Below you will find a list of additional acceptable actions to enter

the presence of Jesus with confidence and humility and experience the blessing of the Adoration of the Eucharist.

Pray on Your Own: Another great activity you can participate in during Eucharistic Adoration is praying on your own. Simply bow before Jesus and pray as the Holy Spirit leads you.

Listen to Music: Music can be a powerful spiritual blessing during your time of Eucharistic Adoration. Pick a playlist of worshipful and reverent songs that will help you focus your thoughts on God and the gift of his son Jesus. Just be sure to use headphones that keep the sound so only you hear it to avoid disturbing others who may be around you.

Read: Reading is another wonderful activity to do during Eucharistic Adoration. There are many great reading options available that can help you make the most of this sacred time, including the following:

- Scripture: Read the holy Word of God while meditating in Jesus' presence. Whether you're on a reading plan or open to one of your favorite passages, time in God's Word is always time wellspent.
- Daily devotional book: Daily devotional books are great for reading a passage of Scripture and getting a concise application for your life to think about throughout the day.
- Religious book: Many high-quality religious books are out there to enrich your spiritual walk and help focus your mind on truth. Talk to your priest, a leader at your parish or a trusted brother or sister in Christ for recommendations on good religious books to read during Eucharistic Adoration.







The Year of Parish Revival

Experience the presence of Jesus during Adoration of the Eucharist

- Eucharistic Adoration involves exposing a consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, allowing people to sit and pray in the presence of Jesus Christ.
- In the presence of the Eucharist, we pray to the power and sacrifice that it represents the body of Jesus, who gave His life so that we may have eternal life.
- Eucharistic adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist.
- Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God.
- Eucharistic adoration is a beautiful time to sit in silence with our Lord and spend time with Him, free from distraction.
- It is a good time to give thanks to the Lord for what He has done in our lives while looking at Him in the gift of the Eucharist.
- While it is true that you can pray to God anywhere and that He is always within you, it is especially powerful to adore Jesus in the Eucharist.
- How to prepare for Eucharistic adoration:

Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions Focus on the mysteries of the rosary, the Passion of Christ, or a particular Scripture verse.

Write in your prayer journal. ...

Listen to praise and worship music through headphones.

Read a book by one of the saints (such as "The Diary of St. Faustina")

- You can come for as long or short as you wish, but while you are there you can simply tell God how amazing He is.
- You don't have to say anything, you don't have to make sure you're "doing" adoration correctly. Instead, experience the joy of being with someone who wants to have a deep, intimate, friendship with you.

Our Parish Faith Formation Committee encourages everyone in our parish family to learn more about this specific topic.


