Second Collection for Diocese of Honolulu Seminarian Education Fund

Men who are accepted as potential candidates for the Catholic Priesthood for the Diocese of Honolulu can expect to spend between seven to nine years as seminarians, living and studying at a seminary, prior to beginning their ministry as ordained priests of Jesus Christ. There are currently five seminarians for the Diocese of Honolulu; John Akau, Preston-Jay Castro, Lawrence "Larry" Denis III, Taylor Mitchell, and Edgar Pobre. Next weekend on June 15 and 16, there will be a second collection for the Diocesan Seminarian Education Fund. All gifts in this category are tax-deductible and will be used towards paying expenses of tuition, room and board (annually totaling approximately \$45,000 per student) for those seminarians enrolled in Theology or Pre-Theology programs. Your gift will directly contribute to the education of our seminarians and is much needed and appreciated.

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL

What do we see at Mass?

Often enough, we encounter liturgical gestures that have grown overly familiar to us. If only we could look deeper. We would see Calvary opening up before us. We would see Christ offering his flesh and blood at the Last Supper, a myriad of angels and saints joining us, and an open road leading us to the heavenly Jerusalem. It takes faith to grasp this and without it, it's no surprise why so many people feel like they don't need to bother showing up. They only see the outside, the shell of our sacramental ritual that lacks life without access to what lies hidden within.

Attending Mass is the most important thing that we should do each week. At the Mass, the great wedding feast of the Lamb, the bridegroom waits for his bride to come, offering an incomprehensible gift: his entire self—body, blood, soul, and divinity. If we truly understood what it was, then how could anyone even consider refusing this invitation?

The conclusion of Mass should not end our communion with Jesus, but rather, anchor it. Communion provides a foundation for the entire Christian life, guiding everything that we do, which, in turn, should lead us back to this encounter each Sunday as our inner life. The practice of adoration follows naturally from intimacy with Jesus in communion. When we grow in friendship and love with him, we seek him out to spend more time with him. While the Church reserves the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist in the tabernacle, after we receive Christ in communion, we in effect carry Christ within us, and ought to find time in our busy schedules to converse with him and adore him in the comfort of our homes. After all, we spend more time at home than we do at Church.
