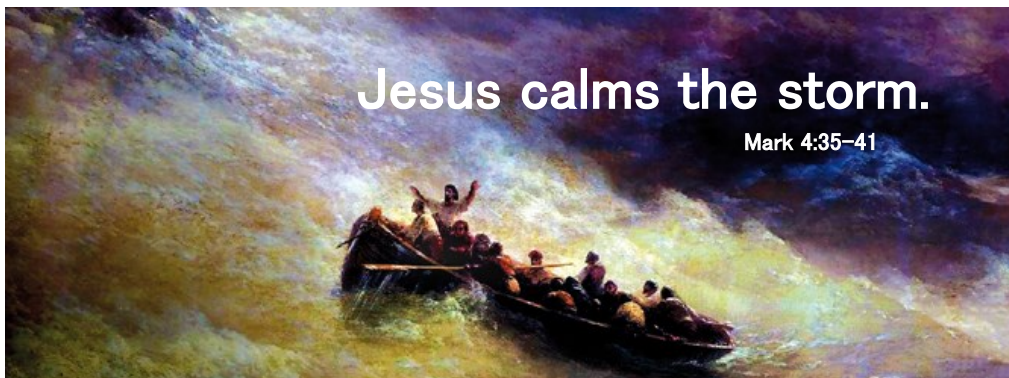

SCHOOL NEWS

During this summer break, our school arranged a few much-needed improvements to our campus and buildings. Some improvements were done by volunteers and others by contractors. We are very thankful for all those who helped with these awesome repairs.

Recently, Ralph Dollar, a school board member and father of two students, has been repairing some of our campus picnic tables. They are located on the Circle of Peace and next to the Parish Hall. All of the tables needed a fresh coat of paint, and we want to thank Cecelia Izuo and the members of the Pali Lions Club who spent a Saturday morning doing this task. The Lions also painted a new hopscotch court and outlined the four existing Four-Square games on the parking lot with paint donated by Hardware Hawaii.

Two classrooms on the second floor of the John Read Center have new windows. Thanks to a crew from Ching Construction, they have new jalousie windows that are fully operational. They also replaced deteriorated sections of the breezeway between the Parish Hall and the John Read Center.

A new pergola is in the process of being constructed which will provide needed shade in front of our music room where students often sit to relax during recess or afterschool. This project was built by Ralph Dollar and John Huffman with materials donated by the PTSH. A few other projects are planned before school starts next month.

CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER



EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Once a year, on Corpus Christi Sunday, we bring our encounter with the Lord to the streets so that others may encounter him as well. In a world marked by constant change, it is reassuring to find an unchanging source of love and nourishment. For Catholics, that source is the Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. John 6 has the **Bread of Life Discourse**. It is vital to Corpus Christi, honoring Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist. It is the Gospel reading for Corpus Christi Mass, emphasizing its central role. In John 6:53, Jesus says, **"Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, ..."** These words challenge us to contemplate their deep meaning. By critically engaging, we recognize Christ's real presence in the Eucharist, a foundational belief. John 6 addresses the spiritual hunger that resonates within many individuals, including Protestants seeking a deeper encounter with Christ.

The Eucharist is the most precious and powerful gift in the world. Christ's presence in the Blessed Sacrament nourishes us throughout our lives. Pope Benedict XVI emphasized this truth in his 2006 Corpus Christi homily. He said, *"In the procession we follow this sign and in this way we follow Christ himself. And we ask of him: Guide us on the paths of our history! Show the Church and her Pastors again and again the right path! ... look upon the physical and mental hunger that torments it! Give men and women bread for body and soul!"*

One of the most significant devotional practices associated with Corpus Christi is the procession. Processions were first established in the 13th century to honor and adore the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. With the public display and veneration of the Blessed Sacrament, they are a visible expression of faith, as believers gather to witness the Eucharist being carried in solemn procession through the streets. This practice began in response to the theological controversies surrounding the Eucharist, serving as a powerful affirmation of Catholic doctrine.

THE OFFERTORY

The gifts are passed by ushers and parishioners process down the aisle with them to hand to the celebrant at the foot of the altar. The priest then places the gifts in a dignified place on the altar and asks God to receive them. The gifts symbolize the people of the parish and the entire Church, as well as the gifts God has given us, such as our work, struggles, joys, money, and lives. The Offertory was very important in the early church, with practices dating back to at least 155 A.D. The gestures and prayers that accompany the liturgical actions are essential theologically, and represent how God invites people to participate in fulfilling his work.
