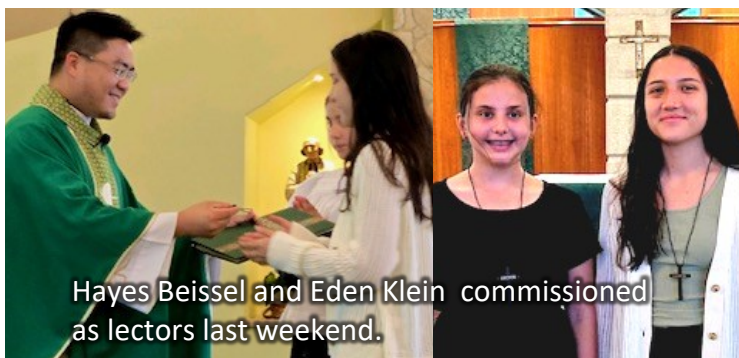


SCHOOL NEWS

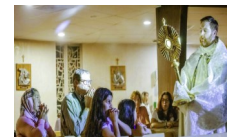
Hayes Beissel and Eden Klein commissioned as lectors last weekend.

The Blood Bank of Hawaii needs 150-200 donors every day in order to meet the needs of Hawaii’s hospitals. Due to the uptick in violence and traumas we are seeing in our community, they don’t expect these numbers to go down. High school blood drives bring in 10% of the overall state’s blood supply. However, with schools out for summer vacation and a 15% decrease in blood donations that they historically see every summer, they are counting on our upcoming blood drive to be a success to help them stay afloat. Basic donor requirements are to be in good health, be 16 years or older (*16-17 years old with BBH parental consent form), weigh at least 110 pounds, have a photo ID with birth date.

Jesus in Encounter Nights

To recap, Encounter Nights are liturgies that include opportunities for Scripture, reflections, and silence to create a reverent atmosphere for parishioners to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. The goal is often to deepen parishioners’ relationship with Jesus, motivate them to learn more about their faith, and to share the Eucharist with others. Such Encounter nights remind us of that Holy Thursday evening where Jesus was intense at prayer, leading to the saving events of the paschal mystery. Encounter Nights are born out of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

During the month of June, we are asked the question: What do we see at Mass? Attending Mass is the most important thing that we do each week. At the Mass, the great wedding feast of the lamb, the bridegroom waits for his bride to come, offering an incomprehensible gift: his entire self—body, blood, soul, and divinity. If we truly understood what it was, then how could anyone even consider refusing this invitation?

Leaving Mass should not end our communion with Jesus but rather anchor it. Communion provides a foundation for our entire Christian life, guiding everything that we do, which, in turn, should lead us back to this encounter each Sunday.

The practice of adoration follows naturally from intimacy with Jesus in communion. When we grow in friendship and love with him, we seek him out, to spend more time with him. While the Church reserves the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist in the tabernacle, when we receive Christ, we in effect carry Christ within us, and ought to find time in our busy schedules to converse with him and adore him in the comfort of our homes. After all, we spend more time at home than we do at Church.

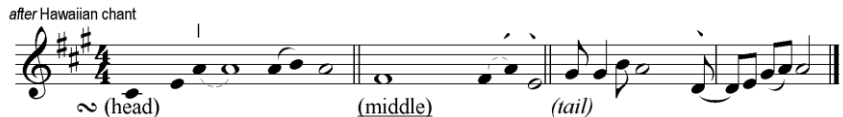

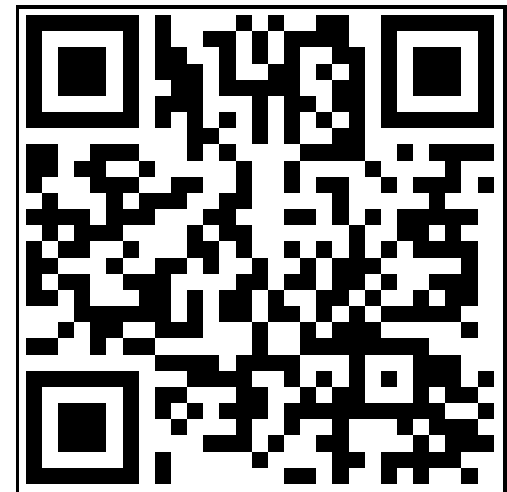
