This Sunday we are reminded about our communality: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." To belong to the Church is to belong to a community of brothers and sisters in Christ. This means that being a Christian is not a private, purely personal affair, although that is the way some people seem to behave. When God asked Cain, "Where is your brother?" Cain answered, "Am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen. 4:9).

The teaching of the Gospel tells us that in every Christian Community, divisions will inevitably happen. We are communities of sinners trying to be saints and there are many pitfalls on the way. It is easy to think that being a Catholic means being concerned with the relationship between God and me that my duty is to *"save my soul"*. But, in fact, the only way to *"save my soul"* is by becoming a truly loving and caring person as part of a loving and caring community of people united in Christ. And sometimes that caring may involve bringing the brother/sister face to face with the loving demands of the Gospel. We do not help each other by turning a blind eye to behavior which is clearly unchristian.

As a community we have a responsibility for each other's wellbeing. We do not further the witness of a loving community when we, in false "*charity*", ignore social problems such as drug-taking, alcoholism, compulsive gambling, violence in the home, discrimination against the physically and mentally handicapped, racial exploitation and the like in a parish community. It is not enough just to deal with these things in the privacy of "*Confession*" for, ultimately, reconciliation must be at the community level. And, as such, this is the responsibility of the community exercising its calling as the Body of Christ.

Apologetics without apology The Sacrament of Confirmation

Although in most of the West, the Sacrament of Confirmation is usually received by Catholics as teenagers, several years after making their first Holy Communion, the Roman Catholic Church considers confirmation to be the second of the three sacraments of initiation (Baptism being the first and Holy Communion the third). Confirmation is regarded as the perfection of baptism, because, as the introduction to the Rite of Confirmation states: *By the Sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.*

The Form of the Sacrament of Confirmation: Many people think of the laying on of hands, which signifies the descent of the Holy Spirit, as the central act in the Sacrament of Confirmation. The essential element, however, is the anointing of the confirmand, the person being confirmed with chrism (an aromatic oil that has been consecrated by a bishop). The anointing is accompanied by the words "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit" This

seal is a consecration, representing the safeguarding by the Holy Spirit of the graces conferred on the Christian at baptism.

The Minister of the Sacrament: As the Catechism of the Catholic Church points out, "The *original minister* of Confirmation is the bishop." Each bishop is a successor to the apostles, upon whom the Holy Spirit descended at Pentecost—the first confirmation. The Acts of the Apostles mentions the apostles imparting the Holy Spirit to believers by the laying on of hands. (Acts 8:15–17 and 19:6.)

Next Sunday, we will take a look at who is eligible to receive Confirmation and the effects of the Sacrament.



How to Explain and Defend your Catholic faith



Upon this Rock I will Build my Church and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it.

The Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation completes the process of initiation into the Catholic community . (see back side)

Focus is on the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles on Pentecost and gave them courage to practice their faith.

APOLOGETICS DEFENDING THE FAITH The Sacrament of Confirmation

- Confirmation, a true sacrament instituted by Christ and different from baptism, is administered by laying-on of hands and anointing with chrism oil and prayer.
- Catholics believe that the soul also needs to grow in the life of grace and the sacrament of Confirmation establishes one as a full-fledged member of the faith.



- The sacrament is called Confirmation because the faith given in Baptism is now confirmed and made strong as one renews the promises made by their parents and godparents at their baptism
- The essential component is the anointing of the confirmand (the person being confirmed) with chrism oil and accompanied by the words "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit"
- The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit given received at Confirmation are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.
- Confirmation is an anointing that completes baptismal graces and gives someone the grace necessary to live out the mission given to all believers
- The specific oil that is used is called chrism and is only used in two sacraments: Confirmation and Holy Orders; both are sacraments in which the person is anointed for ministry.
- The ceremony may take place at Mass or outside of Mass, and the presider wears red vestments to symbolize the red tongues of fire seen hovering over the heads of the apostles at Pentecost.
- Confirmation gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ. It is not graduation from church.
- A candidate must be in a state of grace before receiving the sacrament of confirmation, and today is given immediately following one's first Eucharist.

The Unit Investment Drive will formally begin on September 19th and run up to Halloween. You will receive more information, including how to make investments, as the Investment Drive gears up.


