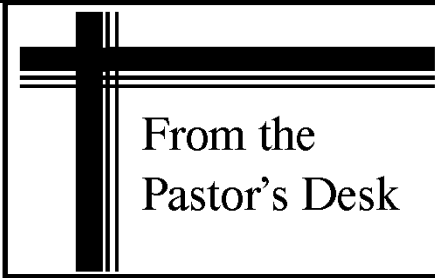

DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

Today we are presented with another challenge by Jesus to the religious leaders of the people. It consists of a parable about two sons whose father operates a vineyard. He tells one to go and work there. The lad refuses but later changes his mind and goes. The second one is also told to go. He agrees to do so but in the end he does not. *"Which of the two did his father's will?"* Jesus asks. They all agree that it was the one who at first would not go but later did so.

In case there was any doubt, Jesus then clearly spells out the meaning of his story. Tax collectors and prostitutes, perhaps the most despised of all people from the religious leaders' point of view, were making their way into the kingdom of God before the chief priests and the elders. In their eyes, it was a shocking and dreadfully insulting thing to say.

There are two messages coming out loud and clear. On the one hand, we can never be complacent about our relationship with God. It is possible for us at any time, to find ourselves falling away from our commitment to Jesus and to His Gospel. And God always accepts us where we are. If we are in union with Him, things are well; if we have by our own choice become separated from Him, he accepts that too. His love and His grace are always available but they can be rejected and spurned, and we can *"die in our sin"*. On the other hand, no matter how far we have strayed from God and Jesus in the Gospel, no matter how depraved we have become, it is never too late to turn back. And, we can be absolutely sure that a warm, no-questions-asked welcome is waiting for us.

Know your Catholic Faith Corner

Apologetics without Apology *Recap on the Sacrament of Confirmation*

Graduation or a beginning? Confirmation establishes the beginning, *not* the end or “graduation,” of a life of full participation and responsibility in the Church. During Confirmation, the Holy Spirit is said to leave an “indelible mark” on your soul; meaning that you are forever one of God’s children. It is the Sacrament where Catholic people decide for themselves that they want to become part of the Catholic Church and follow Catholic teaching. It is given to strengthen the baptized so that they might be more perfectly bound to the Church and, as true witnesses of Christ, spread and defend the faith by word and deed.

Fullness of the Spirit: Confirmation is the Sacrament in which the candidate receives the fullness of the Holy Spirit that was given to us at Baptism. This is the same Spirit that filled the Apostles with the zeal and courage needed by all who are to be public witnesses to Christ. Christians, on the day of their Confirmation, become public witnesses to Christ and his saving works. Confirmation is not our first encounter with the Holy Spirit. The first encounter takes place at Baptism. The Trinity comes to dwell in the newly baptized as they are born again in water and the Spirit. Baptism brings people into a personal union with God. Introduced to the ways of God and the Spirit, the Sacrament of Confirmation continues the process by having the Holy Spirit strengthened within us. Confirmation completes and perfects Baptism.

Completion and a new beginning: The Sacraments of initiation, that is, Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion, complete our full integration into the life of the Church. They become God’s love and presence in our lives. Sacraments give sanctifying grace – the free gift of God’s love, God’s life. They draw humanity into the truth and love of God revealed in Christ, thereby disposing the faithful to live this love more deeply in their daily lives of Christian freedom and witness.

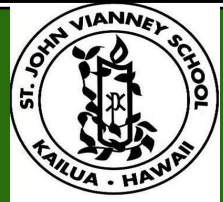

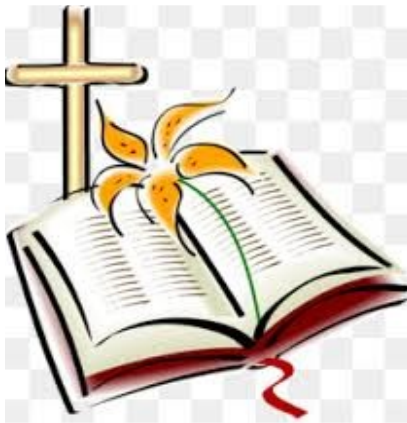


Stewardship of Treasure

PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY

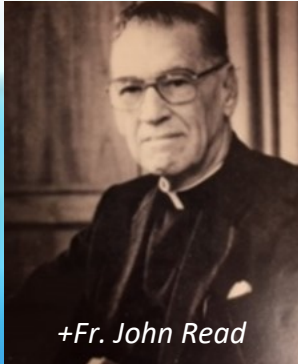

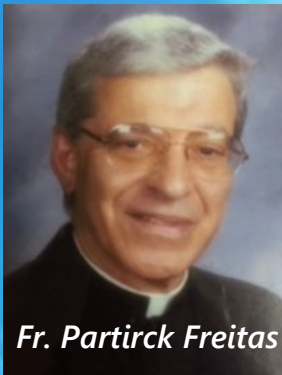

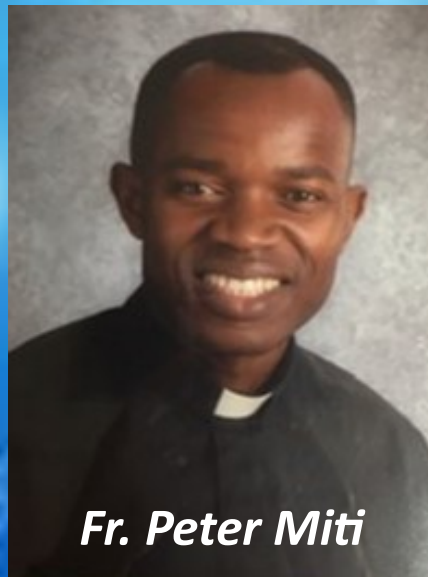

you did not later change your minds and believe him."

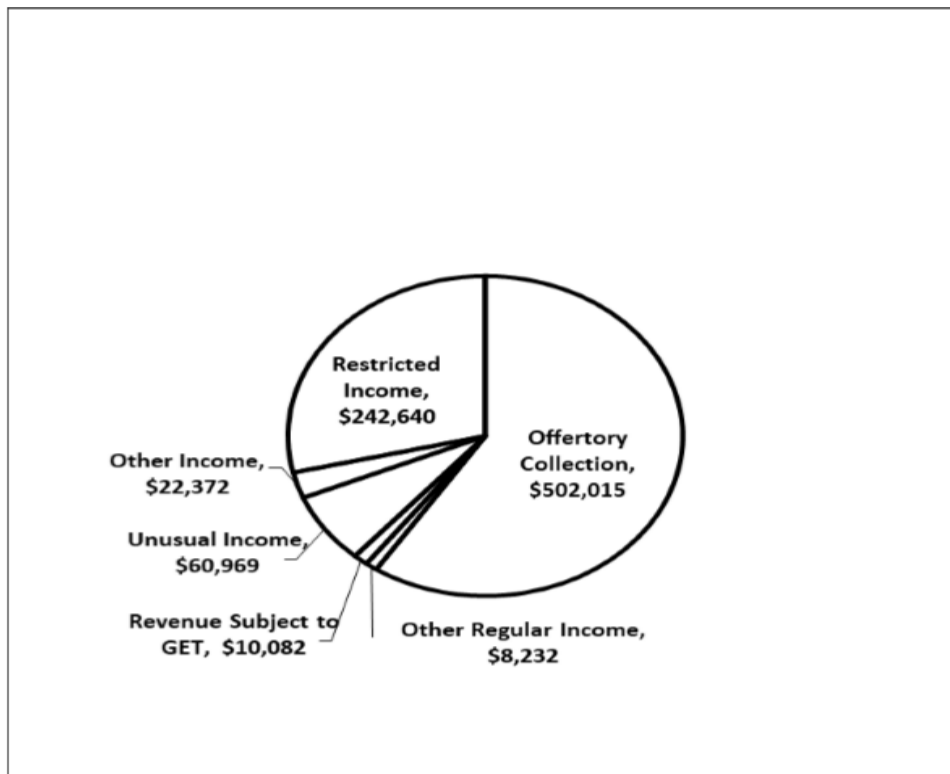

REVENUE DESCRIPTION:

Also includes Holy Day collections (Immaculate Conception, Christmas, Easter) and other feast days (Assumption of Mary, Ash Wednesday, 1st Offering, Ascension of the Lord, New Year's, Thanksgiving, All Saint's and All Souls Day).

Other Regular Income: Offerings for Weddings, Baptisms, Funerals, Blessings and Mass Intentions.

Revenue Subject to GET: General Excise Tax income from fundraising activities and rent (use of facilities).

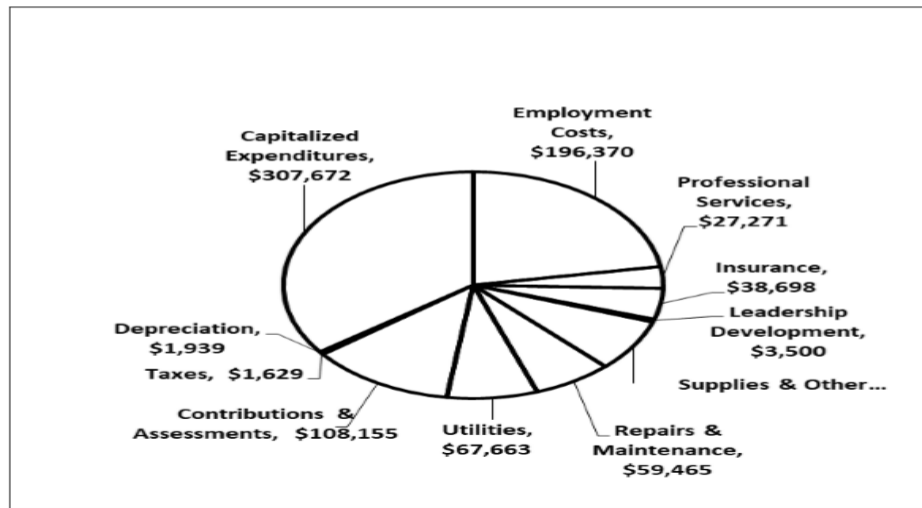
Unusual Income: Unrestricted donations, donations for church flowers and hospitality Sunday.

Article about the screening of "The Story of Plastic" (3 versions)

Plastic -- The Whole Story *Faith Action for Community Equity*

Plastic is cheap, lightweight, durable, and convenient, but the magnitude of the pollution caused by plastic is so great that it now impacts the health of our planet. Nearly every piece of plastic starts as fossil fuel, linking it to climate change and the degradation of human health.

A **free** screening of "The Story of Plastic" is being sponsored by the Environmental Justice Task Force of Faith Action for Community Equity. This documentary takes you behind the scenes to show the pollution caused by the production and processing of plastic, as well as the pollution caused by the disposal of plastic (only 2% is effectively recycled).
