This Sunday, just like the last, we have a parable about the rejection of Jesus by the leaders of His own people. It is addressed to the "chief priests and elders of the people", that is, the religious and civic leaders. The parable divides clearly into three distinct parts: *two invitations sent out to the intended guests; a general call to all kinds of outcasts; some criteria set for taking part in the feast.* With the urgency of the call and refusal of those originally invited to respond to the king's call, the servants are now sent out, not to the houses of the wealthy and respectable, but to the "*crossroads*". These are near the gates and markets of a typical Middle East town where large crowds of ordinary people would gather. Here, there are the social and religious outcasts, tax collectors, prostitutes, all those in despised trades. No exceptions are made. All are invited, good and bad alike.

Without exception, no matter what kind of past they might have had, the same invitation to sit down at God's table is given. There is now no "chosen people", no elite. The Church calls all to its bosom. It is, and always will be, a Church of both saints and sinners. However, today's readings remind us that having initially answered the invitation, we cannot take things for granted. There is no room for complacency. More dangerous than being an obviously sinful person is being the "ordinary, run-of-the-mill Catholic", the "Sunday" Catholic, the "I'm a good enough Catholic", the "I'm a Catholic but not a fanatic about my religion". These are all cop-outs or excuses. And it is not God but ourselves who are the losers. So let us pray for a deeper faith, love and spirit of service that we may keep our wedding garments pure and spotless, and become disciples who hear and live the teaching of Jesus.

Four Marks Of The True Church

If we wish to locate the Church founded by Jesus, it should have four chief marks or qualities of his Church. The Church we seek must be: *one, holy, catholic, and apostolic*. Let us look at these terms.

The Church is One: Jesus established only one Church, not a collection of competing churches. The Bible says the Church is the bride of Christ (Eph. 5:23-32). Jesus can have but one spouse, and His spouse is the Catholic Church. His Church also teaches just one set of doctrines, and those doctrines must be identical to the doctrines taught by the apostles. This is unity of belief.

Although some individual Catholics dissent from officially-taught doctrines, the authentic teaching authority of the Church—the pope and the bishops united with Him—has never changed any doctrine. Over the centuries, as doctrines are examined more fully, the Church comes to understand them more deeply, but it never understands them to mean the opposite of what they once meant.

The Church is Holy: By his grace Jesus makes the Church holy, just as He is holy. This doesn't mean each member is always holy. Jesus said there would be both good and bad members in the Church (John 6:70), and not all the members would go to heaven (Matt. 25:31-46). But the Church itself is holy because it is the source of holiness and is the guardian of the special means of grace Jesus established, the Sacraments.

Next Sunday, we will take a look at the other two marks of the Church: **Catholic and Apostolic**.

Gospel

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." 

Personal and Private Prayer

by Dr. Jeff Mirus—has been a leader in Catholic education and the dissemination of Catholic information for over 40 years There is certainly great power in public prayer, especially the Mass and the Sacraments, by which Christ makes His divine life available to us in a pre-eminent way. Christ also taught that wherever two or three are gathered together in His name, He will be in their midst (Mt 18:20). But the power of Christ's presence, offered to us in all the various forms of public prayer, cannot be absorbed and released into our own lives without personal prayer. For a deep combination of spiritual and psychological reasons, if we fail to pray personally, we not only miss many opportunities to do good, but we slowly smother our own relationship with Christ—no matter how many times we go through the motions of public or group prayer.

Although liturgical prayer can and should be intensely personal, we cannot learn to pray personally, or ever excel at it, unless we are willing to pray *privately*. Our Lord tells us this point blank when he warns us not to be hypocrites, who pray only in public, but to go to our rooms, close our doors and pray privately to our Father, who reads the secrets of our hearts (Mt 6). In fact, the New Testament speaks repeatedly about private prayer (and says comparatively little about any other kind). Jesus prayed at his baptism (Lk 3:21), He frequently went aside to pray alone (see Mt 14, Mk 1 & 6, Lk 5 & 6, etc.), He prayed at the time of his Transfiguration (Lk 9), He prayed that Peter would not fail in his faith (Lk 22), and He prayed mightily during his Passion (Mt 26, Mk 14). Even his great priestly prayer at the Last Supper (for all those the Father had given Him in the world) was an intensely personal prayer said in the presence of the Twelve (Jn 17).

Not surprisingly for one who prayed so frequently, Our Lord also taught often about personal and private prayer. He enjoined us to pray for our enemies and those who persecute, curse and calumniate us (Mt 5, Lk 6);He told us to pray for vocations (Mt 9, Lk 10); He urged us to pray against the temptations and trials of the end times (Mt 24, Mk 13); and He warned us to pray unceasingly (Mk 13, Lk 18, Lk 21). He also explained that we would receive whatever we asked in prayer (Mt 21, Mk 11), and He taught us the Our Father so we would know both how to pray and what kinds of things to pray for (Mt 6, Lk 11). The evidence abounds in the gospels, and this emphasis on personal prayer continues in both the Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles.
