

DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

"What do you really want?" These words are repeated often in our lives. It seems like a day doesn't go by when we are approached or called on the phone by a salesperson. They ask us questions and we can tell right away who they are by their smooth talk. And we think to ourselves "what do you really want?" Husbands and wives often find themselves in the same position: "honey, are you busy?" We know that our mate is not inquiring about the quality of our life. We think, "what does he really want?" Kids in similar situations respond the same way. Sometimes questions are deceiving, and at other times it seems like a trap. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, the Pharisees were getting tired of Jesus and no longer wanted their authority undermined. Therefore, they wanted to trap Jesus with His own words by asking him a question about taxes and politics: "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" He responds by telling them the truth - "repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

The question then is: What is it that belongs to God? The answer is everything! If everything belongs to God, is there a relationship between the Church and the State? The relationship is neither complete union nor complete separation, but more like a collaboration. We should not separate our religion and our politics because we have obligations to Caesar and obligations to God. The Church is supposed to be a voice of conscience. Since government policy has moral implications on family life,; the unborn, human dignity, and many other areas, the Church can question official policies. If we, the Church, don't influence our politics, someone else will push their own priorities. Like St Thomas More, once said, may we be: "The King's good servant, but God's first."

Know your Catholic Faith Corner

Apologetics without Apology-Catholic Church, Pillar of Truth

Four Marks Of The True Church: Last Sunday we took a look at two marks of the Church: One and Holy. This week we take a look at why the Church is: *Catholic* and *Apostolic*.

The Church is Catholic: Jesus' Church is called catholic ("universal" in Greek) because it is his gift to all people. He told his apostles to go throughout the world and make disciples of "all nations" (Matt. 28:19-20). For 2,000 years the Catholic Church has carried out this mission, preaching the good news, that Christ died for all and that He wants all of us to be members of His universal family (Gal. 3:28). Today the Catholic Church is found in every country of the world and is still sending out missionaries to "make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19). The Church Jesus established was known by its most common title, "the Catholic Church," at least as early as the year 107, when Ignatius of Antioch used that title to describe the one Church Jesus founded.

The Church is Apostolic: The Church Jesus founded is apostolic because he appointed the apostles to be the first leaders of the Church, and their successors were to be its future leaders. The apostles were the first bishops, and, since the first century, there has been an unbroken line of Catholic bishops faithfully handing down what the apostles taught the first Christians in Scripture and oral Tradition (Acts 1:15-26). These beliefs include the bodily Resurrection of Jesus, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, the sacrificial nature of the Mass, the forgiveness of sins through a priest, baptismal regeneration, Mary's special role, and much more — even the doctrine of apostolic succession itself. What these first Christians believed is still believed by the Catholic Church. No other church can make this claim of a direct connection.





POLITICAL CORNER

VOTING - A CIVIC, GODLY AND MORAL DUTY

In a few weeks, the USA will go to the polls in one of the most hotly contested elections. And yet, there are some people, including Christians who are ambivalent to it, thinking that politics and faith don't mix. Such a thought would be a misunderstanding of God's nature. If your God is not interested in politics then you are not worshipping the God of the Bible. In the Lord's Prayer for example, we pray that God's Kingdom would come. It is a politically loaded prayer. It is asking that the reign of God would come to fruition here on earth as it is currently in heaven. We pray not that souls would escape up to heaven, but for God's kingly reign to invade our world. We seek God's reign for every second of our Christian lives, not just for one day every four years. So in one sense voting is the very least we can do as believers, playing our part in the democratic process that we have been invited to participate in. But we need to vote with our Christian consciences formed, our hearts and minds opened.

Here are 5 reasons why Christians should vote:

- 1. Voting publicly recognizes that we submit to the authority of the political system in our nation as established by God. (Romans 13:1-7)
 - 2. Voting recognizes the equality of all people and their right to speak and be heard. (Deuteronomy 10:17-19)
 - 3. It is a simple yet significant way we can do something about politics in our nation. (Psalms 34:14) 'All that is required for evil to prevail is for good men and women to do nothing.' (Edmund Burke)
 - 4. Not voting is a form of voting, as it will influence the outcome. We need to take responsibility for our actions, as well as our lack of actions. (Luke 10:25-37)
- 5. Voting is part of our stewardship to use all the resources we have been given in ways that honor God; to waste a vote is to squander a gift.

May God continue to bless our land, the United States of America.



Subject: Invitation to return to Mass and extended dispensation from obligation

Aloha, Sisters and Brothers! Peace be with you!

This year of 2020 has brought us many unprecedented experiences and major adjustments to our lives and livelihoods due to the coronavirus pandemic. While we must not let down our guard and continue to observe prudent hygiene measures, we also want to look optimistically to the future.

With Advent and Christmas coming, it is very important that we prepare ourselves well for these high holy days in which we celebrate the great gift of the Word of God taking flesh and dwelling among us. Therefore, I ask all the parishes to plan their Advent and Christmas schedules in such a way as to accommodate as many people as possible throughout these days.

Since mid-March through October 31, 2020 I have issued a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. I am hereby extending that dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation through December 31, 2020. As I do so, however, I urge everyone who is able to return to Mass, without undue risks to their health or the health of others, to do so.

Please note that in the Diocese of Honolulu, besides all Sundays, the holy days of obligation are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Tuesday, December 8; and Christmas on Friday, December 25. Again, while all are dispensed from the obligation of attending, I urge you to do so if you can.

It is highly recommended that those who do avail themselves of the dispensation substitute some other prayer experience so that worship of God does not lose its primary focus in our lives. One could do a home holy hour, pray the rosary, celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours, or do some reading of spiritual books and articles, especially the lives of the saints. Of course, we also encourage anyone who cannot attend Mass to watch a live-streamed Mass. Sites are posted on our diocesan website at www. catholichawaii.org.

We encourage everyone to reach out to those who may not hear this message on their own and invite them to "Come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord!"
