Take the Red Hill Pledge; Spread the Word By Kiki Mills, FA Staff

Faith Action has committed our support of The Red Hill Pledge: "Without reservations, I will support legislation this year to permanently shut down the Navy's Red Hill underground storage tank facility."

Just 100 feet above the aquifer that serves as Oahu's principal source of drinking water sits the U. S. Navy's 80-year-old bulk fuel storage facility. The facility's twenty steel-lines tanks have the capacity to store 250 million gallons of fuel, making it the largest fuel storage in the United States. Since 1943, more than 180,000 gallons of fuel have leaked from these fuel tanks. This includes the release of 27,000 gallons in 2014 and up to 19,000 gallons in 2021.

Take the Red Hill Pledge. Contact family, friends, representatives and community groups in Hawaii and ask them to support the Red Hill Pledge at www.redhillpledge.com. This will help show decision-makers in D.C. that the people of Hawaii are demanding that Red Hill be defueled and shut down permanently.

Apologetics without Apology

A Year of the Holy Spirit (The Gift of Wisdom)



Have you ever wondered what life would be like if Jesus were here on this planet walking and talking with us? Would decisions be easier? Would we feel more at peace? Well, the truth is, it's better for the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to be here with us than if Jesus were here in the flesh (<u>John 16:7</u>). Jesus didn't leave us to wander this world alone. He left us a helper and guide. When you are baptized and <u>become a Christian</u>, you receive the Holy Spirit. The Spirit gives each of us <u>specific gifts</u> to use, to better the Church and the world around us.

In 1_Corinthians 12:7-11, an early church leader named Paul writes to Christians in Corinth, and lists some of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The first gift Paul names in 1_Corinthians 12:8 is the gift of *Wisdom*. This gift can easily go unnoticed. Wisdom is not flashy, but wisdom is necessary for the church to live and love like Jesus today. The question is: How can we recognize the gift of wisdom.

According to 1 Corinthians 12:8, Wisdom is not the same as knowledge. Paul separates wisdom and knowledge as two different gifts from the Holy Spirit. Knowledge acquires facts and recites God's truth. Wisdom knows when and how to apply God's truth to a specific situation. When wisdom is put to use, a "knowing" truth turns into a skill of insight and putting God's work to work.

General ways to use the gift of wisdom:

Personally: assist family or friends in making good decisions.

Within the Church: adapt a ministry, task force or committee.

Within the wider community: serve on any of various community service boards that are available.

The Gift of Wisdom Received from the Holy Spirit

"Through wisdom, we come to value properly those things which we believe through faith." (See back side)

A Year of The Holy Spirit

"the Lord and giver of life"

- 1. Wisdom is the first and highest gift of the Holy Spirit because it is the perfection of the theological virtue of faith.
- 2. With the gift of wisdom, we see God at work in our lives and in the world. ... It is the gift whereby self-evident principles are known.

(St. Thomas Aquinas)

- 3. Wisdom is the ability to exercise good judgment. It distinguishes between right and wrong, seeks and upholds truth and justice, and balances personal good with the common good.
- 4. And God gave Solomon wisdom and understanding, exceeding much, and largeness of heart, even as the sand that is on the seashore. (1 Kings 4:29)
- Do not forsake wisdom, and she will protect you; love her, and she will watch over you. Wisdom is supreme; therefore get wisdom. (Proverbs 4:6-7)
- 6. Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom; for Moses had laid his hands upon him: and the children of Israel hearkened unto him, and did as the LORD commanded Moses. (**Deuteronomy 34:9**)
- 7. That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him. **(Ephesians 1:17)**
- 8. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy & good fruits, without partiality, without hypocrisy. (James 3:17)
- 9. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. (Colossians 3:16)
- 10. We need the gift of Wisdom: because we are sacramental beings who are called to turn our faith into concrete works of love the way the Holy Spirit of Wisdom fashioned the world in love and Jesus, the Wisdom of God, was made flesh.
