FAITH LEADERS SUPPORT CHANGES TO CASH BAIL SYSTEM (HB 1567)

When a person is arrested in Hawai'i, a judge sets a cash bail amount that person has to pay. The idea is to ensure that person shows up to court. If that person has money, they get to go home. They are allowed to continue to work, pay bills, and be present with their families. If that person does not have money, they go to jail. They are punished because they don't have money. Only the poor are punished.

Apologetics without Apology

A Year of the Holy Spirit (The Gift of Wisdom)



The mysteries of God are vast and wide. They are deep and transforming. But so often we fail to understand. It is because of this that we consider Understanding, the Gift of the Holy Spirit, in the eighth chapter of the Letter to the Romans. St. Paul treats Understanding in a particularly profound and touching way. He writes about how God speaks to our souls; the Holy Spirit speaking in "sighs too deep for words." (Rom. 8:23ff.) There are moments in our lives when only the Spirit of God can properly articulate the human need for Divine assistance, for Understanding. It is a sense of empathy and compassion that comes from the Creator reaching deep into the heart of the creature, in a way only God can do. The Gift of Understanding, as such, allows the Creator entry into that space in the human person that needs reassurance and Divine Love. In the power of the Holy Spirit, the Divine Inventor provides exactly what a human soul requires.

Understanding also requires a certain amount of study so our soul is ready to receive this gift. How can you begin to understand someone without a sense of who they are or how they speak? Good spiritual reading will help us pattern our lives after Christ; the one who came so that all may believe. The Catechism of the Catholic Church contains the whole of God's plan, and when lived out, allows us to receive His love and be ready to give it to those around us.

As we continue our Lenten journey and beyond, consider spending more time in Eucharistic Adoration. Make time, in the presence of God, to pray for Understanding, and ask Him to help define or refine your vocation in this life. When you pray in His presence, keep listening for illumination from the Holy Spirit; get caught up in the wonder of the Creator.

The Gift of Understanding Received from the Holy Spirit

"Understanding allows us to grasp, at least in a limited way, the very essence of the truths of the Catholic faith." See back side)

A Year of The Holy Spirit

"the Lord and giver of life"



- 1. Understanding is the second gift of the Holy Spirit, that we receive in Confirmation.
- The Holy Spirit's gift of understanding allows Christians to obtain "intimacy with God" and helps them understand things "as God understands them." (Pope Francis)
- 3. This gift does not entail a complete understanding of the mysteries of faith, like fully comprehending the mystery of the Holy Trinity or the Real Presence; rather, a person understands that these mysteries are credible;
- 4. Then Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. (Luke 24:45)
- 5. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (**Philippians 4:7**)
- 6. Solomon prayed "Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil." (1 Kings 3:9)
- 7. Without the gift of Understanding, we are left on our own to try to make sense of life, especially when we are faced with hardship and suffering.
- 8. The Catechism explains that we receive the gift of understanding to enable us to know more clearly the mysteries of faith . (CCC No. 1831).
- 9. But it is the spirit in man and the breath of the Almighty that makes him understand. (**Job 32:8**)
- 10. We need to pray for this gift especially when we are making life decisions. We ought to pray to know the perspective of God or, as the Bible phrases it, to understand "the ways of God."

It is the Memorial of St. Damien DeVeuster. At the end of the Mass, there will be a short ceremony to formally open the Diocesan Inquiry Phase of the cause of Servant of God Joseph Dutton. The members of the Joseph Dutton Guild will be present, and the officials who will play various roles in the investigation of the cause will take their oaths of office.

It should be noted that beatification and canonization in the Catholic Church is a rigorous process, and there is no guarantee that the process will finally result in Joseph Dutton's beatification or canonization. Nevertheless, many of the faithful in the Diocese of Honolulu and in other parts of the world have spoken favorably and are hopeful that Joseph Dutton's holiness of life will be deemed by the Church to be worthy of public veneration and imitation. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will guide this process to its completion according to the will of God and for the good of his holy Church.
