CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER

A Year of the Holy Spirit *The Gift of Knowledge*



This month of July we will be looking at the Gift of Knowledge. Knowledge, here, is not simply that which is acquired by reason; for example, through science or by faith, such as, revealed truths. However, such knowledge, especially knowledge of our faith, is important for the actualization of this gift of the Holy Spirit. The Baltimore Catechism defined it as “a gift of the Holy Ghost which enables us to see God reflected in all creatures and to praise Him in them, but yet to see the nothingness of creatures in themselves so that we will desire God alone.”

Given the above definition, one could say that the Gift of knowledge helps a person embrace the truths of faith. Then, formed by these truths and guided by the Holy Spirit, the person makes correct judgments regarding earthly things and how they are related to eternal life and Christian perfection. As such, the knowledge of these created things leads one to the Creator. The created things are not seen as ends in themselves and held onto tightly so that they become idols or obstacles to union with God; rather, they are instruments that help us appreciate the majesty of God and over which we must be good stewards. Also, while things of this world perish, God is eternal. As Pope Francis stated (May 21, 2014), “When our eyes are illumined by the Spirit, they open to contemplate God in the beauty of nature and in the grandeur of the cosmos, and they lead us to discover how everything speaks to us about Him and His love. All of this arouses in us great wonder and a profound sense of gratitude.”

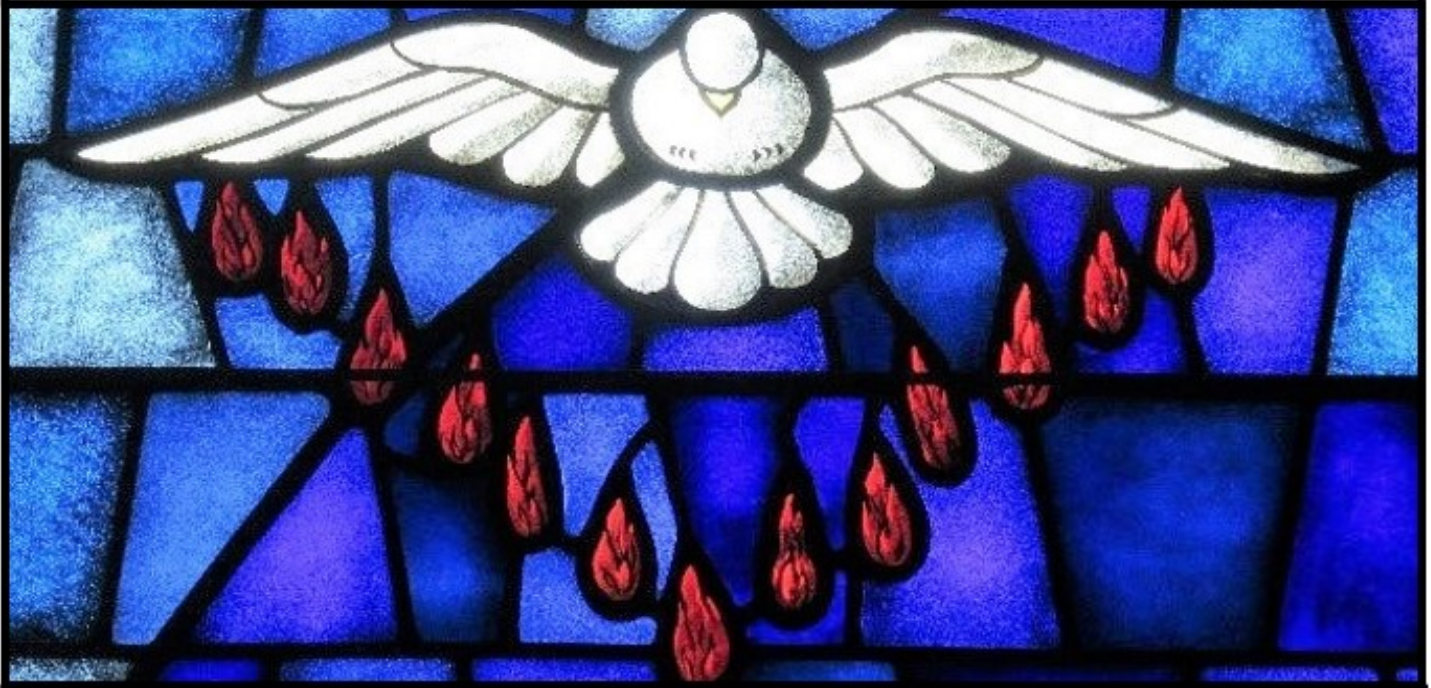

1. The fifth gift of the Holy Spirit is Knowledge, which allows us to see the circumstances of our life the way that God sees them.
2. Through the Gift of Knowledge, the Holy Spirit guides our judgment so that we can recognize created things —especially human thoughts, words, inclinations, circumstances, and deeds—in the light of Faith.
3. Knowledge allows us to comprehend the meaning and purpose God has for us and to live up to this meaning.
4. As Christians, we should not think of Knowledge as a collection of simple facts, but also as the ability to choose the correct path.
5. The Gift of Knowledge enables a person “to judge rightly concerning the truths of faith in accordance with their proper causes and the principles of revealed truth.” **(Father Jordan Aumann)**
6. The Gift of Knowledge makes it possible to distinguish between good and evil and then choose our responses and actions accordingly.
7. “Knowledge enables those who have the gift to discern easily and effectively between the impulses of temptation and the inspirations of grace.” **(Father John A Hardon, S.J.)**
8. The Gift of Knowledge makes us rejoice in what God has done in creating us and promising us a share in the love and life of God offered to all.
9. We are given the Gift of Knowledge to help us make a complete and penetrating agreement to the truth of faith.
10. “Now, brethren, if I come to you speaking in tongues, how shall I benefit you unless I bring you some revelation or knowledge or prophecy or teaching.” **(1 Corinthians 14:6)**

Hello, my name is Amy, I recently found myself in a situation alone, without a lot of financial resources, and pregnant.

Not knowing how to be able to afford food, I turned to St. Vincent De Paul. Immediately they were very prompt in helping me. They spent a lot of time on the phone with me to identify not only my immediate needs, but also to see if there were ways they could help me progress with my future.

With the help and encouragement, I am now in classes to finally get my GED. I was homeschooled and never did get it. I've also started a part time job that I am able to do while pregnant. They also provided me with gift cards to Safeway. I went the day they arrived and loaded up on tons of fruit, which is something I've been craving. They also sent me a \$75 dollar coupon to target. I am going to use this for an electric toothbrush, as recently my dentist highly recommended one for me, especially since I am pregnant and tooth aren't as strong while pregnant. I'm very excited to get one!!

I am so grateful to also find out that they will be paying for my car to be shipped from Maui to Oahu. I lived in Maui for 2 years, but once I found out I was expecting, I moved to Oahu to the Mary Jane Maternity home, and I couldn't afford to ship my car. This is such a relief and will also help me with finding another part time job. They also agreed to pay one month of my car payment, and a month of my cell phone bill. This is the most generosity I've ever experienced, and I'm just so beyond grateful.

With all of the help and care, it's motivated me to really push forward, stay positive, love God, and also just be able to experience the beauty of people helping out. I love this and it makes me want to pay it forward.

I'll never forget all of the help they have offered me. I'm so grateful.
