BSA Scouts Troop 311 Court of Honor

This past week, SJV Troop 311 conducted a Court of Honor to award over 60 merit badges and 20+ rank advancements, including five scouts who reached the highest rank of Eagle. With the addition of this last cohort of Eagle Scouts, a total of 85 young men and women have attained the rank of Eagle since the troop was formed in 1979. A National Medal of Merit, the first for Troop 311, was also awarded to David King for his meritorious act of rescuing two lost hikers and their dog last year. We are seeking candidates for our School Board. Members are advisors to the Pastor and Principal in strategic planning for your parish school. All those interested please contact the school.



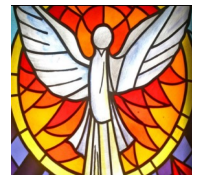
A big Mahalo to all who helped during Holy Week and Easter

Apologetics without Apology

A Year of the Holy Spirit (The Gift of Counsel)



In this month of May, we will look at one of the special gifts of the Holy Spirit, that of Counsel. It perfects the virtue of prudence. Its function is to enable a person to judge promptly and rightly, as by a sort of supernatural intuition, what should be done, especially in difficult situations. With the gift of counsel, the Holy Spirit speaks, as it were, to the heart and in an instant enlightens a person what to do. It corresponds to the promise made by Christ to his followers, “When they hand you over, do not worry about how to speak or what to say; what you are to say will be given to you when the time comes; because it is not you who will be speaking; the Spirit of your Father will be speaking in you” (Matthew 10:19).

What does the Gift of Counsel do for us? First, the Holy Spirit gives us another form of practical wisdom. He helps us to know what is right and good, especially in circumstances where the truth is difficult to see. Second, the Holy Spirit reveals God’s care for us as He lends us His aid in knowing and choosing goodness. Third, the Gift of Counsel helps us to recognize the moral law as a gift from God that leads us to true goodness. Fourth, the Gift of Counsel shows us how following the moral law is an act of love. This is especially true when doing so requires sacrifice and hardship. By following the moral law, we return the love that God shows to us in giving it to us. Fifth, the Gift of Counsel gives us the desire to love more selflessly as Jesus loved and to grow in holiness. As can be seen, the Gift of Counsel is a great example of how God invites us to take part in His Divine Life.

How can we live the Gift of Counsel in our everyday life?

—Make turning to the Holy Spirit a habit whenever you struggle to know what is right in a particular situation.

National Medal of Merit

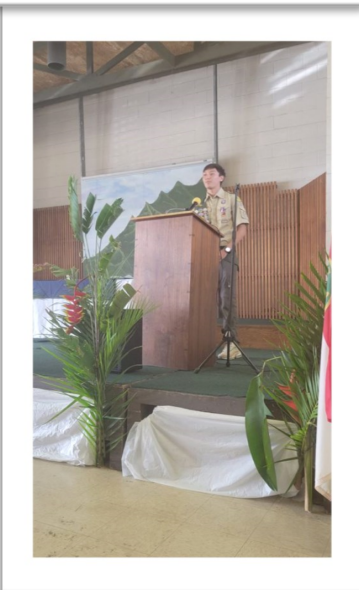

1. The third gift of the Holy Spirit is Counsel, which helps us to judge promptly, correctly and intuitively.
2. This gift enables a person to judge individual acts as good and ought to be done, or as evil and ought to be avoided.
3. The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, But a wise man is he who listens to counsel. (**Proverbs 12:15**)
4. This gift prompts the person to ask himself, "Is this act true to Christ and the teachings of His church?"
5. I will praise the LORD who counsels me— even at night my conscience instructs me. I keep the LORD in mind always. Because He is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. (**Psalms 16:7-8**)
6. It corresponds to the promise made by Christ to his followers, "When they hand you over, do not worry about how to speak or what to say; what you are to say will be given to you when the time comes; because it is not you who will be speaking; the Spirit of your Father will be speaking in you." (**Matthew 10:19**).
7. Enlightened by the Spirit, a person learns what to do in a specific case and what advice to give when consulted or command to make if he is in authority.
8. By the gift of counsel we "grow in the virtue of prudence, learning to overcome our self-centeredness and to see all things with the eyes of Christ," (**Pope Francis**)
9. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit—the Father will send Him in My name—will teach you all things and remind you of everything I have told you. (**John 14:26**)
10. The more closely we are united with the Holy Spirit, the more we can go through life and do the most humanly impossible things, wisely and correctly, because we are being guided by the Spirit of God.
