#### Second Collection for next weekend, Nov 5 & 6

National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services USA (AMS). The collection is approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years, to both increase awareness and support of the mission, "Serving Those Who Serve." The ministries offered by the AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, veterans, and their families. It is the mission of this Archdiocese that they be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, first communion, penance, and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest, and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty. In addition, the AMS co-sponsored seminarian program is the only vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains—and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. After a seminarian receives approval from his bishop or religious superior to participate, education and other formation costs are shared between the AMS and the seminarians home diocese or religious order. Once the priest is ordained, he first serves for three years in his home diocese or community before being released for full-time military service for at least five years. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or community.

### CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER

A Year of the Holy Spirit (Inviting the Holy Spirit to take over our Lives)



As we wrap up our journey in this year of The Holy Spirit, it is true that we all live busy lives with loads of things to be done. Prayer time can be hard to come by. However, we have seen that even if we might not have the time to sit down for an uninterrupted marathon prayer session, we can still say short prayers all day long. Simply talk to God like He's standing right there next to you (because He is) as you go about your daily chores and responsibilities. Chances are you have thoughts in your head about your day, what you're going to do, or various situations that are going on in your life. Don't just talk to yourself about them. Tell God about them! Call the Holy Spirit to be your companion as follows:

- Invite the Holy Spirit Into your Prayer Time: During your prayer time welcome the Holy Spirit by inviting Him into your day and giving Him room to speak and "touch" you.
- Talk to the Holy Spirit Throughout the Day: In the Book of Joshua (1:9), we are told that God lives in us by His Spirit, and that He goes with us wherever we go. With this understanding, it means that you hear from Him at every moment of your life wherever you are if you pay attention.
