A Year of the Holy Spirit The Gift of Fortitude



The month of June leads us into reflecting on the Gift of Fortitude. Fortitude supports us in living out the other six gifts (Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Piety and Fear of the Lord) and making our way faithfully through our earthly life to blessed eternity with God.

Fortitude is, in a way, the easiest gift to understand. There are times that we struggle. Sometimes love demands more of us than we think we are able to give. God does not abandon us at those times. He gives us his strength. Fortitude is the strength we need to get through.

It's really impossible to think about Catholic morals without the Gift of Fortitude. God does demand the impossible of us. The Church doesn't teach that the moral life is easy. And please never forget this: the authentic teaching of the Catholic Church does not teach that you just have to try harder on your own. Catholic moral teaching (which we might call the doctrine of the difficult parts of the active life, the parts governed by Counsel and Fortitude) is about what the Holy Spirit can accomplish in us. We are not meant to do it on our own, because at the heart of Catholicism is the belief that we don't have to do it on our own. God helps. He gives us the strength to do what we cannot do ourselves. It is the Holy Spirit who makes us heroes.

In Scripture, the greatest example of fortitude, is seen in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Whether facing physical deprivation and temptation (Mt 4:1-11), strong and powerful criticism (Mt 12:1-8) or betrayal and death on the cross (Mk 14), Jesus resisted temptation, endured criticism and forged ahead to the cross despite terrible pain. Jesus was sustained by the Gift of Fortitude, God-given endurance to see the journey through to its glorious end.



- 2. The Holy Spirit consoled Jesus with the gift of Fortitude as he overcame the greatest temptation in the Garden. His sweat became like drops of blood, yet He accepted the will of the Father. (Bishop William Callahan)
- 3. He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth'; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter. (Isiah 53:7)
- 4. St. Maximilian Kolbe not only had great fortitude to offer his life promptly in exchange for another and to endure a horrible death, but had faith in life forever with Jesus Christ.
- 5. Fortitude is the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulty and constancy in pursuit of good. (CCC1808)
- 6. St. Pope Pius V exercised the gift of Fortitude after the Council of Trent. He initiated many reforms to correct errors started by Martin Luther down the path of the Reformation. He revised the Roman Missal and Breviary, issued the Roman catechism, reformed the Roman Curia and more.
- 7. The gift of Fortitude fills us with the spirit of professing and defending our Catholic faith in an age of relativism and secularism.
- 8. The lack of fortitude shown by the Israeli army facing Goliath was countered by David's strength of mind as he put on Saul's armor and picked up his sling. (1 Samuel 17)
- 9. Daniel faced fortitude when he faced the Lion's den in prayer. (Daniel)
- 10.But the Lord help me, therefore I have not been disgraced, therefore I have set my face like flint and I know I shall not be put to shame. (Isaiah 50:7)
