Second Collection supports those who serve in the military

National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services USA (AMS). The collection is approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years, to both increase awareness and support of the mission, "Serving Those Who Serve." The ministries offered by the AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, veterans, and their families. It is the mission of this Archdiocese that they be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, first communion, penance, and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest, and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty. In addition, the AMS co-sponsored seminarian program is the only vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains—and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. After a seminarian receives approval from his bishop or religious superior to participate, education and other formation costs are shared between the AMS and the seminarians home diocese or religious order. Once the priest is ordained, he first serves for three years in his home diocese or community before being released for full-time military service for at least five years. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or community.

CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER A YEAR(S) OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



On June 19, 2022, the Bishops of the United States launched an exciting initiative called the National Eucharistic Revival. This revival will conclude on Corpus Christi 2025. The Eucharistic Revival has the stated mission to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist." All dioceses in the United States are invited to participate in this three-year initiative to increase Eucharistic devotion among the faithful and spread the Gospel message to those who have not yet received it, and the Diocese of Honolulu is participating in full.

The Eucharistic Revival comes on the heels of the worldwide synodal process requested by Pope Francis to put on an apostolic mindset as we find ourselves navigating an apostolic age. This Revival will be integral in helping the Church to put on an apostolic mindset by calling us to divine intimacy, without which no one could ever see as God sees nor love as he loves.

May this holy period of revival bring enlightenment and growth in our love of the Real Presence of Jesus in the species of bread and wine.

- RE: 2023 LITURGICAL NOTES FOR THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU (Year A, Sundays; Year I, Weekdays)

Miscellaneous Notes

1. As a reminder in our diocese the Holydays of Obligation are two: the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception** (December 8, the Patroness of the USA); and **Christmas** (December 25). The faithful are encouraged to attend Mass on the other holydays of obligation celebrated in the United States of America (See Dates to Remember below.). Pastors are therefore asked to provide practical opportunities for more people to attend Mass on these days by celebrating a Vigil Mass (when permitted) or an extra Mass or two at hours convenient for the faithful.

2. The 2023 liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2022 (including its Vigil on Saturday, November 26).

3. Anniversary of the Dedication of the Parish Church – This date should be celebrated as a Solemnity by the parish, unless impeded by a day of higher rank. (*The Order of the Dedication of a Church and an Altar*, Chapter II, para #27 and *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, para # [R10]).

4. Memorial of the Patron(s) of the Parish – This date should be celebrated as a Solemnity by the parish, unless impeded by a day of higher rank. (*Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar* (by Pope Paul VI in 1969) para # 59 (Table of Liturgical Days) I, #4a.)

5. The celebration of the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord in our diocese is transferred to Sunday, May 21, 2023.

6. Outside Advent, Christmas Time, Lent, and Easter Time, on Saturdays which have

no commemoration having the rank of Obligatory Memorial or higher, a Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary may be celebrated. The readings and prayers may be selected from the *Collection of Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary*.

7. It is appropriate to include in the Universal Prayer (General Intercessions) the Holy Father's intention for each month, found in the <u>Paulist Press Ordo</u> on the first day of each month.

Dates to Remember (2023)

Sunday, January 1 – Mary, the Holy Mother of God (Solemnity)

Sunday, January 8 – **The Epiphany of the Lord** (Solemnity)

Monday, January 9 – **The Baptism of the Lord** (Feast)

Monday, January 23 - **Memorial of Saint Marianne Cope, Virgin** (Obligatory Memorial in the Diocese of Honolulu.)

Sunday, January 22 – **Sunday of the Word of God -** Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, Motu proprio "Aperuit illis" published on September 30, 2019, establishes that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God.")

Wednesday, February 22 – **Ash Wednesday** (Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in the Church.)

Sunday, February 26– First Sunday of Lent – Rite of Election for Catechumens to be initiated at the Easter Vigil.

NOTES:

- 1. If the Scrutinies for the Elect are celebrated on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, the readings for those Masses should be for those of Year A.
- 2. Priests should be sure to schedule one or more occasions for the anointing of catechumens with the Oil of Catechumens.
- 3. Chrism Masses are tentatively scheduled as follow:
 - a. Thursday, March 23- Maui/Lanai Vicariate
 - b. Thursday, March 30 East/West Hawai'i Vicariates
 - c. Tuesday, March 14 Kauai Vicariate
 - d. Tuesday, April 4 Oahu Vicariates

Monday, March 20 – Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Solemnity).

Saturday, March 25 – The Annunciation of the Lord (Solemnity).

The Sacred Paschal Triduum

Thursday, April 6 – Thursday of the Lord's Supper

Friday, April 7 – Friday of the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday)

Saturday, April 8 – The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night

Sunday, April 9 – **Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord** (Solemnity, at Masses with a congregation, the rite of the renewal of baptismal promises, used at the Easter Vigil, may take the place of the Creed after the homily.)

Wednesday, May 10 – **Memorial of Saint Damien de Veuster** (Obligatory Memorial in the Diocese of Honolulu.)

Sunday, May 21 - **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord** (Celebrated on Sunday in the Diocese of Honolulu.)

Sunday, May 28 – **Pentecost Sunday** (Solemnity)

Monday, May 29 – The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church (Memorial)

Sunday, June 4– The Most Holy Trinity (Solemnity)

Sunday, June 11 – The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi (Solemnity)

Friday, June 16 – The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (Solemnity)

Saturday, June 24 – The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist (Solemnity)

Thursday, June 29 – Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles (Solemnity)

Sunday, July 9 – **Our Lady, Queen of Peace, Principal Patroness of the Diocese of Honolulu** (Celebrated as a Solemnity in the Cathedral Basilica <u>ONLY, this year.</u> In the rest of churches of the Diocese of Honolulu it is NOT observed.) (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar, para # 59 (Table of Liturgical Days, section I & II.)

Tuesday, August 15 - The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Solemnity)

Wednesday, August 16 – **180th Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace** (Celebrated as a Solemnity in the Cathedral Basilica and with all the proper prayers in all other churches of the Diocese of Honolulu.) (*Dedication of a Church and an Altar*," Chapter II, para # 26.)

Wednesday, November 1 - All Saints (Solemnity)

Thursday, November 2 – The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed – All Soul's Day (Not a holyday of obligation anywhere in the USA, but pastors are encouraged to add Masses for the convenience of the faithful. Note that there is a wide selection of possible Scripture readings, so the parish or community should choose beforehand the Scriptures it prefers.)

Sunday, November 26 – Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Solemnity)

Friday, December 8 – **The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary -Celebrated** (Solemnity, holyday of obligation in the Diocese of Honolulu. Additional Masses should be offered for the convenience of the faithful.)

Monday, December 25 – **The Nativity of the Lord - Christmas** (Solemnity, holyday of obligation in the Diocese of Honolulu and throughout the world; additional Masses should be offered for the convenience of the faithful. NOTE: Masses celebrated after 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 24 should be vigil Masses of Christmas, not Masses of the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The obligation to attend Mass applies to both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and to Christmas.)

CATHEDRAL BASILICA OF OUR LADY OF PEACE

GAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE WHEN VISITING THIS BASILICA

The faithful who devoutly visit this basilica and within it participate in any sacred rite, or at least recite the Lord's Prayer and the Profession of Faith, may obtain a plenary indulgence on each of the following days:

January 23 - Memorial of St. Marianne Cope

May 10 – Memorial of St. Damien of Molokai and anniversary of the granting of the title of Basilica to the Cathedral

June 29 – Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, apostles

July 9 – Solemnity of Our Lady, Queen of Peace, Patroness of the Diocese of Honolulu and of the Cathedral Basilica

August 16 – Anniversary of the dedication of the Cathedral

November 2 – All Souls' Day

Once a year, each of the faithful may freely choose a special day for themselves.

To gain the plenary indulgence, the following usual conditions must be met:

- sacramental confession, with an intention to renounce all attachment to sin
- reception of Eucharistic Communion
- prayer for the intention of the Supreme Pontiff.


The reception of Penance and Holy Communion may be done within several days of the visit. If the conditions are not met, then the indulgence is partial.

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church, which, as minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfaction of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part of all of the temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead. [*Indulgentiarum doctrina*, Norms 1 – 3]
