# CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER





As Catholics, we recognize Jesus' Eucharistic presence to be the source and summit of our faith. Nonetheless, we can take His presence at Mass and in the tabernacle for granted. We pray through our liturgical rituals, but our words and gestures can lack meaning when we simply go through the motions. When we use the beautiful ritual of the Mass and sacraments to guide our prayer, however, they can lead us into a deeper encounter with Christ.

There are many online resources and books that have been written on this topic to remind us of Jesus Real Presence. Two books can help understand the Mass and Sacraments better and to approach them with fresh eyes: Christopher Carstens' A Devotional Journey into the Mass: How the Mass Can Become a Time of Grace, Nourishment, and Devotion (Sophia, 2017) and Msgr. Nicola Bux's No Trifling Matter: Taking the Sacraments Seriously Again (Angelico, 2018)

**Let us pray:** Heavenly Father, reawaken our wonder at your Son's presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. May our hearts burn within us as He opens the Scriptures and breaks the bread. Give us the eyes of faith to recognize His presence in our brothers and sisters, especially in the face of the poor and the suffering. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



# A Eucharistic Revival


To renew us by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

- 9. Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire your response as you fan the flames of revival in our parish!
- 10. Jesus needs each one of us to be his hands and feet throughout this Eucharistic Revival.
