

CATHOLIC FAITH CORNER A YEAR (S) OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



In this month of January, we will look at the Last Supper. Catholic Christians share with most Christians the faith that Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, ate a final or last supper with his Apostles. This final meal was also the celebration of the Jewish Passover. or Feast of the Unleavened Bread, which commemorated the passing over of the Jews from the death of slavery to the Egyptians, to life in the Promised Land.

In the Sixth chapter of John's Gospel, at the end of his public ministry, Jesus used the context of a Passover meal to make a connection to the reason why he came, which was, to offer himself for our sins. This was at his Last Supper. (That is why the Mass is not only a sacred meal, but a sacred sacrifice.) He declares to them that his flesh is real food and that his blood is real drink. As startling a declaration as it is, it was an invitation to have faith that he was from God and, in fact, that he was the Word of God become flesh. Thus, his Last Supper involved a direct connection with his crucifixion. In the sacrifice of the altar, which we call Mass, Jesus' sacrifice becomes real presence. Those who eat and drink worthily of his Body and Blood, share in his passion, death and resurrection.

To receive Holy Communion is more than an action of physically eating the Host and drinking the Precious Blood. It is to take the whole Christ into ourselves. When we consume food, we generally think of it being assimilated into our bodies. It is different when we eat and drink of Christ's Body and Blood. It is we who are assimilated into Christ. In other words, who Christ is by nature, we become through grace. That is our full participation as members of the Body of Christ. We share in Christ's divinity. For that reason, it is important to reflect deeply on what we become by our reception of Jesus in the Eucharist.
