Apologetics without Apology

A Year of the Holy Spirit (The Gift of Wisdom)



Last week we saw that according to 1 Corinthians 12:8, Wisdom is not the same as knowledge. Some writers have said that we can know a lot of stuff and still be foolish. Paul separates wisdom and knowledge as two different gifts from the Holy Spirit. Knowledge acquires facts and recites God's truth. Wisdom knows when and how to apply God's truth to a specific situation. When wisdom is put to use, a "knowing" truth turns into a skill of insight and putting God's Word to work.

To some degree, the gift of Wisdom is often bestowed on certain members of the Body of Christ, to know the mind of the Holy Spirit and to receive insight into how this knowledge may best be applied to specific needs arising in the Body of Christ. In the early church, a "message of wisdom" served a revelatory purpose by enabling some to interpret for the wider community the mind of God in the Holy Spirit. The Apostles and Prophets exercised this gift regularly. To a larger extent, the wisdom that Paul received resulted in a considerable amount of Scripture.

Wisdom is a unifier, not a divider (James 3:17): When difficulty arises or a decision must be made, someone with the gift of wisdom knows how to speak God's Word over the situation, in a way that moves people toward united and peace. When voices sway opinions left and right, wisdom skillfully applies truth, to turn everyone toward Jesus in disarming way.

Biblical references:

1 Cor. 12:1-8—The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person for the good of all. The spirit gives one person a fullness of wisdom, while to another person the same Spirit gives a message full of knowledge.
