SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE



Mississippi native **Steffanie Beissel** and her husband, Perry, were fortunate enough to be stationed in Hawaii from 2003-2006. So in 2009, when the Army reassigned them again to Hawaii, they already knew they wanted to live on the windward side, if at all possible, and to raise their family here. Steffanie has always believed that “God puts you where you are supposed to be.” Luckily for us at St. John Vianney Parish, this is where God put her.

Steffanie’s earlier career included work as a teacher, a lawyer, and a counselor to veterans returning from long deployments in need of a re-orientation to civilian life. She became the elementary religious education coordinator at SJV Parish in 2017, and in 2018, also took on the responsibility of the youth ministry program, combining her responsibilities into the general role of religious education coordinator. In this position, Steffanie is responsible for the religious education of students from pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade. This includes preparation for the sacraments of confirmation and first Eucharist, as well as general education and formation in the Catholic faith.

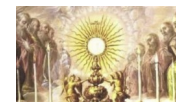
When our diocese transitioned to the original order of the sacraments of initiation, so that confirmation is administered to second-graders, Steffanie realized that new efforts were needed to sustain the commitment of young people to attend church and to understand their faith. They were no longer in a “holding pattern” waiting to be confirmed as teenagers. Some of her efforts have included bible study classes for girls, and also for parents. As she notes, the Church tells us that parents are the primary teachers of the faith to their children. But many parents feel poorly-equipped to fulfill that role. Steffanie has developed lessons and activities to promote their success. She has also significantly developed the use of social media as a means of outreach about our faith and the activities of our young people.

The Beissel children model much of the behavior Steffanie has sought to encourage among students in general. Reagan is a musician deeply involved with the SJV youth praise and worship band. Tyler is a lector. Hayes is an altar server and a cantor.

Sadly, Steffanie will be leaving the parish religious education coordinator position at the end of June because she has accepted a full-time assignment as a religion teacher at Sacred Hearts Academy in Kaimuki, which allows her to live her passion of educating students in the classroom. She will be greatly missed as a staff member here, but she and her family are still parishioners and will remain actively involved in ministry with the church.

Asked if she has any words of wisdom for the next religious education coordinator, Steffanie said: “It’s not just a job; it’s a ministry. It provides opportunities to interact with people of all ages. I learn something new every day.”

What the Saints had to say about the Eucharist

In 2013 her life changed while attending an International Prophetic Consultation gathering of leaders in Bethlehem, Israel. While in Israel, she experienced a dramatic conversion as she prayed in the Upper Room in Jerusalem, believed to be the site of the Last Supper and Pentecost.

Evangelist **Kathleen Beckman**, a popular presenter on topics including the spiritual life, Eucharistic life, healing and deliverance ministry, Divine Mercy, Mary, and the spirituality of Blessed Conchita Cabrera. She is author of four best-selling books, "Praying for Priests", "God's Healing Mercy", "When Women Pray", and "A Family Guide to Spiritual Warfare".
